Prayer of Confession Luke 18:9-14, Isaiah 64:6 November 4, 2018

WARM-UP QUESTIONS:

- 1. What does our secular culture think about the act of confession? What about the Christian culture?
- 2. Do you think confession is easier or harder the older one gets?
- 3. How do you feel when someone you know is deadly honest about themself in a conversation with you?

REFLECTION QUESTIONS:

- 1. Read the passage in Luke. When you enter the presence of God, do you usually think of yourself as a saint or a sinner? How does this reflect one's view of God? How might this be evident in how we pray and engage in other spiritual practices?
- 2. In Jesus' comments on this Temple scene, why was the Pharisee's prayer rejected? Why was the tax collector's accepted? What is the lesson to be learned?
- 3. How does God reach out to Pharisee-like people?
- 4. Is viewing ourselves only as sinners a healthy, holistic practice? Is there a distinction between being honest about our brokenness and despair?

APPLICATION QUESTIONS:

- 1. What does confession reveal about God and about us?
- 2. Describe an experience when you were compelled to reflect on an difficult truth about yourself. How did the experience change you?
- 3. Pastor Nate says: "Confession isn't always about admitting we did something wrong. It can be a prayer of honesty about our fears or inadequacies." Take some time to share a confession with someone you trust and pray for each other.
